

It has brought the square's residents together and most help out with the gardening and resourcefully finding plants to make it a beautiful place to enjoy. 	South Hill Park Green Flag entrant Walk from play area across the Broadwalk. Buggies will take the judges across North Lawn. South Hill Park is attractive, historic parkland of landscaped gardens, lakes and woodland, all of which surround a Grade II listed building which is used as an arts centre. The park has recently been restored back to its former glory, thanks to a £2.3 million grant by the Heritage Lottery Fund and the Big Lottery Fund. Restored original features include a Yew Walk and Italian Garden. A new pond and 200m boardwalk to the north of South Hill Park mansion, enables the public to enjoy views over the reed marsh.
