ES53/24 ONGOING PROJECTS

The following projects have been completed and will be removed from this list:

• The Elephant Pump funded by Bracknell Town Council via AquAid Water Coolers has been installed in the Manicaland Province in the highlands of Zimbabwe. It will provide up to 10,000 litres of clean, safe drinking water per day for upwards of 300 people for decades. The pump was built by an experienced Africa Trust team leader, with the assistance of the local community, using more readily and locally available materials. This allows the community to repair the pump more easily should they need to, which in turn extends the life of the pump.



The following projects are ongoing:

- Indian Bean Trees
- Eco-friendly weed control systems are being researched
- Five-Year Plan for Refurbishment:
 - Following a walk around Braybrooke Recreation Ground with Ian Evans the Recreational Facilities Manager – Councillor Mac Hale would like the following to be considered when Braybrooke is next put forward as a project
 - Planting more bulbs and foxglove seeds in woodland locations by the pond.
 - To investigate planting a stumpery with ferns at the Eastern Entrance to the park in the shaded area
 - To prune and thin out the fruit trees
 - To plant more saplings by the North entrance to the Park.
 - Continuing with the rewilding of areas near the woods
 - To consider installing more equipment suitable for teenagers
 - To upgrade the knee rail around the pond This is already being quoted for and will be carried out in the next few months.
 - More signs around the park explaining the different areas and especially at the Pond explaining the history of the pond.

- Easier toilet access if not possible more signage explaining the process
- To look at making the slopes leading up from the pond safer removal of the chain link fencing.
