(27 March 1897 – 12 February 1958) was an English mathematician and <u>physicist</u> most famous for the development of <u>numerical analysis</u>

(Peter) Higgs	(29 May 1929 – 8 April 2024) was a British <u>theoretical physicist</u> , professor at the <u>University of Edinburgh</u> , and <u>Nobel laureate in Physics</u> for his work on the mass of <u>subatomic particles</u> .
(George Frederick) Searle	(3 December 1864 – 16 December 1954) was a British physicist and teacher.

William Edward Ayrton	(14 September 1847 – 8 November 1908) was an English <u>physicist</u> and <u>electrical engineer</u> . Worked on <u>railway electrification</u> , produced a <u>dynamometer</u> and the first electric <u>tricycle</u> . Ayrton is also known for his work on the electric <u>searchlight</u> .
Bertram Vivian Bowden	(18 January 1910 – 28 July 1989) was an <u>English scientist</u> and <u>educationist</u>
Chatelet	BTC List
Sir James Dewar	(Sept. 20, 1842 Kincardine-on-Forth, Scot.—died March 27, 1923, <u>London</u> , Eng.) was a British chemist and physicist whose study of <u>low-temperature</u> <u>phenomena</u> entailed the use of a double-walled <u>vacuum flask</u>
Louis Essen <u>OBE</u>	6 September 1908 – 24 August 1997) was an English <u>physicist</u> whose most notable achievements were in the <u>precise</u> measurement of <u>time</u> and the determination of the <u>speed of light</u> .
Feynman	BTC List
William Gilbert	(24 May 1544 – 30 November 1603), was an English physician, and physicist
Ayrton House Bowden House Chatelet House Dewar House Essen House Feynman House Gilbert House

	An influential composer and conductor, Bennett was also the principal of the Royal Academy of Music.
Sir Arthur Sullivan	Famous for his operatic collaborations with W.S. Gilbert, Sullivan was also a conductor.

Sir Charles Hallé	A German-born composer and conductor who became a naturalised British citizen and founded the Hallé Orchestra.
Malcolm Arnold	(1921-2006) Renowned for his symphonies and concertos, Arnold was also a conductor.
Ralph <u>Vaughan</u> Williams	(1872-1958) - A prominent composer of symphonies and choral music, Vaughan Williams also conducted.
Frank Bridge	(1879-1941) - Known for his chamber music and orchestral works, Bridge was also a conductor.
Gustav Holst	21 September 1874 – 25 May 1934) was an English composer, arranger and teacher. Best known for his orchestral suite <u>The</u> <u>Planets</u>
Richard Layton	(1815 – 21 March 1893) was an organist and composer
Katharine Mary Adela Maddison	(15 December 1862 – 12 June 1929), usually known as Adela Maddison, was a British composer of operas, ballets, instrumental music and songs.
Sir Donald Francis Tovey	(17 July 1875 – 10 July 1940) was a British <u>musical</u> <u>analyst, musicologist</u> , writer on music, composer, conductor and pianist.
